

### WORDS FROM THE NERDS

This column is for members who are interested in all things technical. It will cover such things as lighting, sound, rigging etc., indeed all aspects of the technical side of theatre.







#### **PURCHASES**

Garrick has purchased four EL Stage Lighting 19x15W RGBW 245W LED Moving Head Zoom Wash 10-60degree model SKYART E-M19157Z in October '22 to be used for Bernie's Olde Tyme Music Hall. This provided lighting for actors walking down the aisle, in front of the stage, the pianist/MD, the MC on stage, and to provide colour for the various scenes. The purchase of the Zero88 FLX48 Lighting desk in 2019 allowed for easy control of the moving head lights, a feature we are now using. The four new lights allow for more flexibility with lighting design and for lighting musicals.

We also purchased a new Bailey 7 Step P170 Job Station Fibreglass Platform ladder in January, for safe access to the 2 front of house lighting bars. A fibreglass ladder is required when working near live electrical equipment such as when focussing theatre lights. The ladder has retractable wheels for ease of moving and is stored in the shed. Having a platform at the correct height allows for the safe focussing of lights, with 2 points of contact on the ladder platform, which meets the Code of Practice. We also have 2 smaller fibreglass platform ladders for use on the stage when working with the lights. Last year the theatre arranged for an inspection of the lighting bars, to ensure that we provided a safe working environment. It was found that support rods from the roof apex were required. These support rods were installed, and a new lighting bar was installed in the auditorium for the new LED moving head zoom lights. This is to prevent the filaments of the Selecon zoom profile conventional lights, used for lighting the downstage lighting areas failing, due to vibrations.

After all this work was completed late last year, we had a visit from Worksafe, and the Inspector found all technical aspects of the theatre were compliant.

The workshops will be conducted via Zoom, for a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 12 participants. The reason for using a Zoom format is so that the participants will all take an active role on setting up and running the workshop under Don's direction and supervision.

The sessions can be run in short 30-90 minute durations, at a time that fits in with the availability of the theatre, participants and Don Allen. Using Zoom allows the workshop to be recorded so that participants can access the session content later on and a transcript is available for each session. Garrick Theatre has a Zero88 FLX S48 lighting
desk with a 24" touch screen monitor.
Garrick has good lighting resources. The lights
are currently rigged in what is referred to
Rig, which as a Square One Rig, which suits
most productions without any major work
required. Usually, the only refocussing required is the
upstage lighting, depending on whether the
production is using projection or not. The
new Moving Head Zoom Wash fixture allow front colour
and ease of focussing, to to supplement the six
conventional zoom profile lights that provide the
downstage lighting.


